Ken KK9N is presented with a new Mic Mixer for his Ham Shack of course, you understand he picked it out, paid for it!

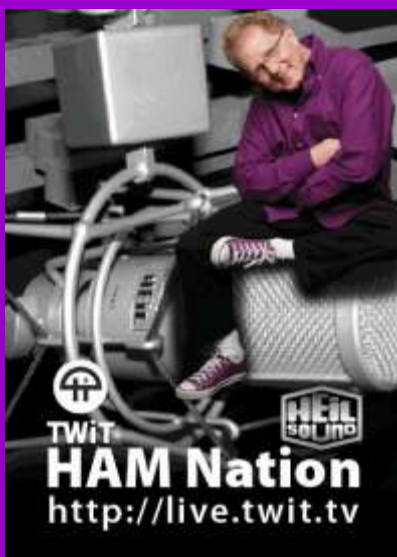

During Emergencies, when all communications are down within the city of Greenville, the HAM radio is used as redundant communication to contact Bond County EOS and Department of Public Health. Following an 8 week class taught by John King W9KXQ, two Bond County Health Department employees, Monica Rensing KC9VBK and Karen Bare KC9VBJ, are now licensed Amateur Radio Operators.
