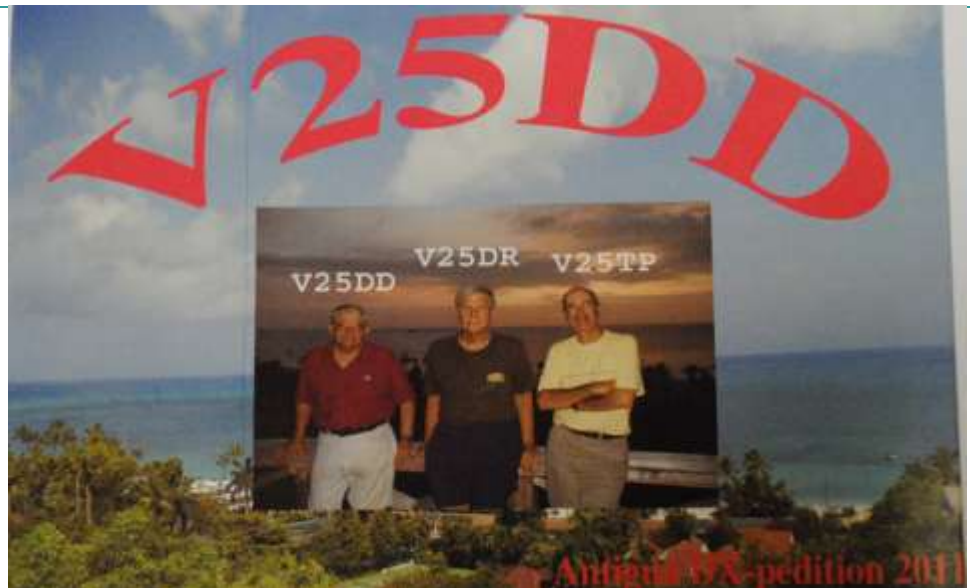

Minutes Highlights for August 4, 2011

President Ken Norris KK9N called the meeting to order at 7:36 PM on Thursday August 4, 2011 in Room 106 of the Kaskaskia College Education Center on Third Street in Greenville. There were 16 people present when the meeting began, but more came during the meeting—mostly new elementary school hams and their parents.

The minutes of the June meeting were approved. There was no July meeting because it would have fallen so close after Field Day. Howard N9GEQ reported a balance of \$745.42. Our insurance was due August 1. There is a 30-day grace period. John W9KXQ will get an inventory list to Howard soon to submit to the new ARRL carrier. The treasurer's report was approved.

John W9KXQ reported that since our June meeting we have secured three brand new deep cycle batteries purchased by 911. John installed batteries for 911 in exchange for getting the batteries for our system. The 2 meter repeater is working.

Jim Thibeault KF4NBN reported that at the VE testing at Field Day we had one young lady upgrade to General. The next testing was at 10:00 a.m. the following Saturday in Highland.

Ken KK9N provided an update on HR607. There was strong support among the members present for a fox hunt perhaps in October at Patriot's Park.

Saturday, August 6, the Macoupin County ARC is sponsoring a hamfest at the Macoupin County Fairgrounds. Our club will be helping the Bond County Fair Parade line up Tuesday, August 9. The ARISS Sat-1 transponder was successfully launched yesterday from the ISS. Ken is looking for ideas for a program for our September meeting. Bob Heil's Ham Nation program is on Tuesday nights 8:00 pm CDT on TWIT-TV. Marc N9LIS presented John W9KXQ with an award recognizing his anniversary this coming week of 50 years since he got his first amateur radio license.

Ken KK9N asked the trivia corner question: From what grid square did the OVARC operate from for Field Day 2011? Jim knew it was EM58. The F6FVY web site can show the grid square of locations.

Our program was in two parts. Ken reported on our points for Field Day 2011. This year we totaled 2,216 points. Typically we earn 1600-1800 points. John and Jim made presentations of engraved mugs to participants. The second part of tonight's program was a video Ken showed about a Youth DX Adventure in Costa Rica in July 2010.

John W9KXQ sold 50/50 tickets. Jerry WB9NEY won \$5.00 and donated his winnings to the treasury. The meeting adjourned at 9:08.

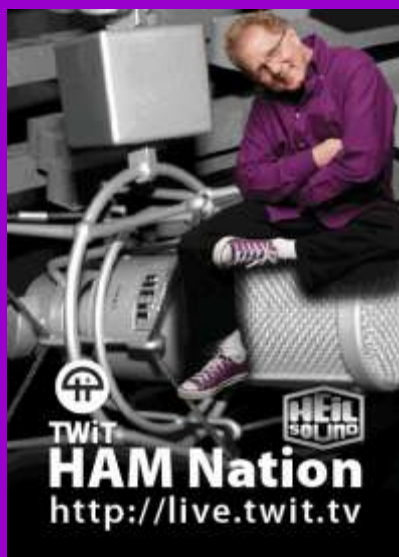

John was first licensed as KN7QLL in 1961 at the age of 14. He earned his Novice license at that time and later (1 year exactly) obtained his Technician license and the call K7QLL. Over these 50 years, John has held several call letters and has held every class of amateur license except the Conditional class. Those license classes were, Novice, Technician, General, Advance, Extra.

On March 11, 1998 he obtained his Amateur Extra Class license and has held his current call W9KXQ since 1968.
